


The Arizona We Want: The Decade Ahead

Gallup Arizona Survey findings provide foundation for ten-year action agenda.



7 Shared Public Values

...where 70% or more of Arizonans agree on what is most important to the future of Arizona – with strong support across geography, income, education level, political affiliation, and race or ethnicity.



Arizonans' Shared Public Values



Education

• A highly educated and skilled population

Arizonans Want Action



Arizonans overwhelmingly support more than 40 actions to move our state forward.

- 92% want to ensure all Arizona public schools have highly qualified teachers and principals
- 86% support making mental health services available and affordable for all
- 74% support the transition to clean energy
- 73% favor sending all registered voters a ballot by mail while maintaining in-person voting options
- 77% believe Arizona prisons should focus more on rehabilitation
- 86% support comprehensive immigration reform that includes a pathway to citizenship

Gaps Between What We Want and What We Have



Gaps between what we want and what we have include:

- About one in four (26%) agree that the state's K-12 public education is high quality
- 60% of Arizonans are satisfied with the quality of healthcare they receive, leaving more than 2 million Arizonans dissatisfied
- 46% of Arizonans earning less than \$60,000 a year are satisfied with opportunities to advance their education or training in our state
- 55% of residents in rural areas have access to broadband/high-speed internet in their homes, which is critical to virtual learning and employment
- 28% of Arizonans with children say the cost of childcare is preventing them from going back to work or school
- 28% of Arizonans agree race relations are good

Gallup Survey Action Agenda

42 Actions To Drive Arizona Forward

Education

- Ensure all Arizona public schools have highly qualified teachers and principals.
- Increase the number of Arizona high school graduates that enroll in universities, community colleges or technical/trade schools.
- Close gaps in educational outcomes for vulnerable populations (e.g., low-income students, students with disabilities, English language learners).
- Provide affordable, accessible and reliable internet and technology to all students.
- · Make civics education a priority in K-12 education.
- Structure the school day and school year to better match the needs of working parents.
- Reduce the financial barriers to attending college.
- · Give Arizona schools the flexibility to tailor learning to each child.
- Spend more money on K-12 public education.

Health and Well-Being

- Guarantee affordable healthcare and insurance for Arizonans with preexisting health conditions.
- Make mental health services available and affordable for all Arizonans who need them.
- · Ensure all Arizonans can get quality healthcare without risk of financial harm.
- Expand public reporting on the quality of hospitals and healthcare facilities.
- · Improve state-level management of public health emergencies.
- · Expand programs to reduce substance abuse.
- Guarantee coverage of telemedicine services by health insurance providers.
- Increase access to wellness programs and alternative medicine.
- Expand Arizona's Medicaid (AHCCCS) program to include more lower-income residents.

Jobs and Economic Opportunity

- Create more opportunities to build careers in Arizona, especially for young people.
- Improve economic stability for lower-wage workers through improved work benefits, greater education and training, and opportunities to advance.
- Improve pay equality and opportunities for promotion.
- Provide more affordable, high-quality options for childcare.
- Ensure equitable and inclusive economic recovery.

Environment and Sustainable Future

- Preserve and protect Arizona's rivers, natural areas and wildlife.
- Put regulations in place to protect rural water supplies.
- Increase spending and measures to prevent forest fires on state land.
- Reduce the heat island in our urban areas and across the state.
- · Protect and expand open spaces for parks and outdoor recreation.
- Improve air quality.
- · Transition to clean energy.

Civic Engagement and Leadership

- Create ways to come together to better understand and work through our differences.
- Ensure a more responsive, transparent, data-driven culture in elected leadership.
- · Create a pipeline of civic leaders who are thinking long-term about the future.
- Offer early in-person voting over multiple weeks leading up to election day.
- Offer automatic voter registration when applying for a state ID/driver's license.
- Send all registered voters a ballot by mail, while maintaining in-person voting options.

Fair, Just, and Equitable Systems

- Address systemic racism as a key issue for the future success of the state.
- Work to combat discrimination on the basis of gender, religion or sexual orientation.
- Work to ensure the criminal justice system treats everyone fairly.
- Reform Arizona prisons to focus more on rehabilitation, including substance abuse, mental health, and reentry programs and services.

Immigration Reform

- Enact comprehensive immigration reform that includes a pathway to citizenship.
- Create a path to citizenship for DACA recipients/"DREAMers" (residents without lawful immigration status who were brought to Arizona as children).



The Arizona Voters' Agenda

New survey research centers priorities of Arizonans in election

What do Arizona's likely voters consider the most important issues facing our state, and what do they want candidates to address as they compete for their votes in this election?



Significant Agreement on Many Issues



- Ensure Arizona's schools have quality teachers and principals (97% total support)
- Invest the state's budget surplus in critical infrastructure improvements (e.g. education, public safety, roads) over cutting taxes (82% total support)
- Secure Arizona's water future and address long-term drought (95% total support)

Significant Agreement on Many Issues Con't.



- Preserve Arizona's rivers, natural area, and wildlife (96% total support)
- Expand career and technical education opportunities (97%)
- Creating a functioning border for commerce and immigration (87% total support)

Voters Believe in the Integrity of Elections




Large majorities of voters say Arizona elections are fair, secure, and accurate.




Confident in the accuracy of the results of the recent August Primary Election



Confident that the results of the November General Election will be accurate






Arizona Voters Want to Keep Voting Easy and Accessible




Voters expressed broad support for continuing early in-person voting and do not favor eliminating mail-in voting.

problems




Prefer candidates who are committed to their principles and refuse to compromise.


Candidates Could Have Done More to Talk About What's Important
